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
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New Name, New Logo, Same Mission

This new name reflects a broader mission and vision that positions the organization to have a larger national and international footprint. The hope is that the Academy will spread to other cities around the world, inspiring and training others to lead informed and contributory lives.

The global pandemic forced the Academy to pivot the in-person Summer Symposium to a fully on-line program. This change opened the program to students across the US and world, with over **70 young changemakers from six states and five countries!**



The 2020 program featured Shabana Basij-Rasikh, girls' education advocate; Sheri Scavone, Executive Director of WNY Women's Foundation; and author Alexandra Zapruder, along with discussions about the Seneca Tribe's influence in the women's rights movement, and becoming culturally and racially literate.

Teaching 2020: Becoming an Antiracist Educator

Following the deaths of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and others affected by systemic racism and police brutality, the Academy re-dedicated its programs to be actively antiracist.

Over **100 educators** from across Western New York participated in the Fall 2020 webinars that inspired and equipped educators to teach about systemic racism, the history of race in America, and strategies their students could utilize in becoming antiracist leaders in their schools and communities.

This series featured Civil Rights Freedom Riders Jim Zwerg and Joan Trumpauer Mulholland, educator Dr. Tracey Benson, diversity consultant Toni Amos, and authors Adam Rutherford and Caroline Randall Williams.



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2020 was a year of change - a global pandemic, a movement for racial justice, and a divisive election showed us that now more than ever we need to be upstanders. In 2020 and beyond, the Academy for Human Rights will continue to speak out about injustices in the community and world, and provide education and resources for educators, youth, and the greater community to take action.


AHR's Statement on Systemic Racism

AHR Co-Founders Receive Recognition




